The Creative and Digital Media industry is a dynamic force of innovation and opportunity, shaping not just what we consume but how we experience it. From photography and film to esports, advertising, games, and sound design, it blends creativity with technology across every medium. "At its core, digital entertainment is driven by film, music and video games, which together support over 305,000 jobs across the UK." Over the past decade, these sectors have seen remarkable growth in video game sales, which rose from £1bn in 2012 to £4.57bn in 2026, film from £443m to £4.21bn, and music from £461m to £1.8bn. As digital platforms continue to expand, so do the career opportunities – making this an exciting space to shape culture, spark innovation, and build a future.

Careers in Creative and Digital Media

Many careers in Creative and Digital Media are accessible without a degree, with employers often valuing creativity and hands-on experience as much as formal qualifications. However, highly technical roles such as video game development and film editing typically require a university degree. As of 2026, 74% of the creative workforce hold a Level 4 qualification or higher, compared to 46% across the wider economy, with the figure rising to 81% in the video games sector. There are still excellent opportunities for those entering with lower-level qualifications, especially when paired with strong personal skills and real-world experience. The UK creative industries now support 2.4 million jobs, including permanent and self-employed roles across film, TV, music, performing arts, and digital services.

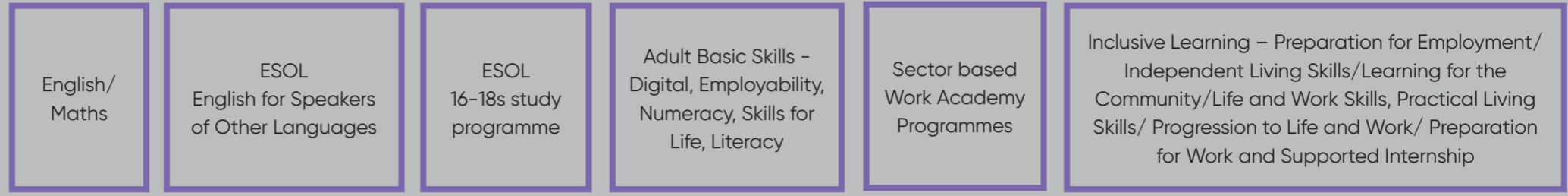
There is huge variation in esports Coach salaries, with most non-athlete salaries falling anywhere between **£27-£33k**. For example, NLC coaching monthly rates (the top level of UK League of Legends) varies widely with top teams offering **£1,000 to £2,000**, while the average wage for an esports Event Organiser is around **£28k p.a.**; as many Floor Managers work on a freelance basis, day rates can range from around **£120 to £400**, while salaries in permanent positions tend to start at around **£21k**, rising to **£45k** for senior television floor manager roles; Games Artists and Designers annual salaries start at around **£30k to £37k**, while lead artists and senior designers can earn from **£52k to £65k+**.

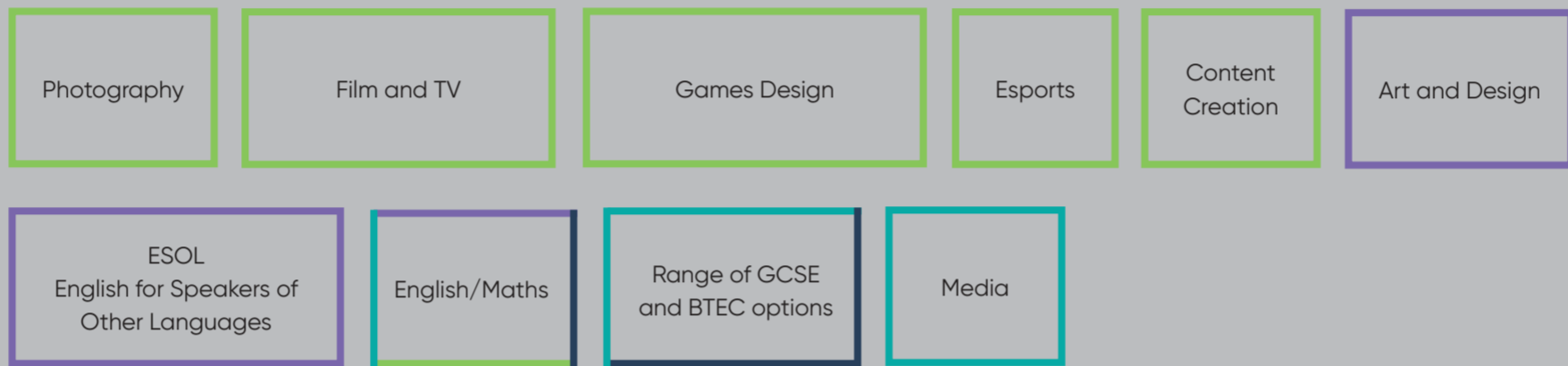

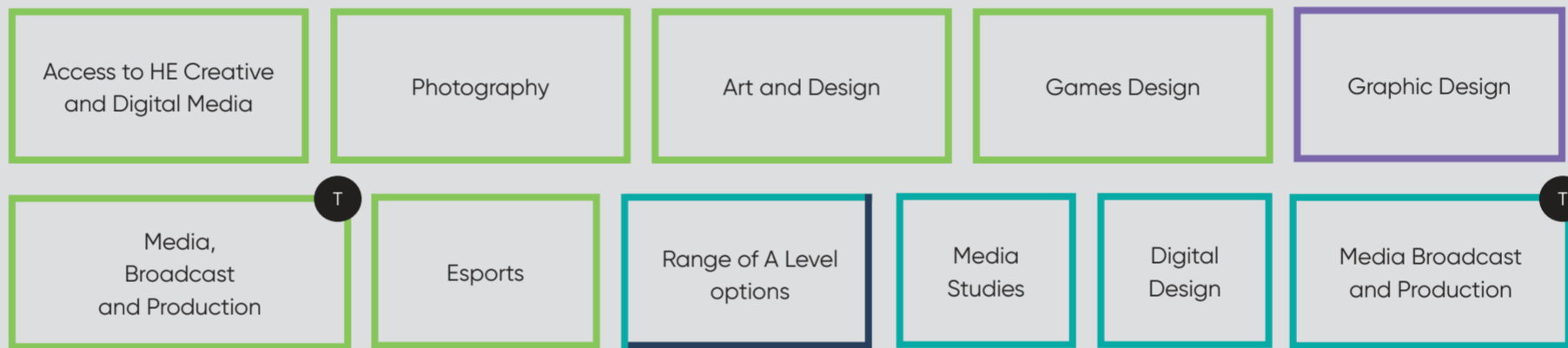

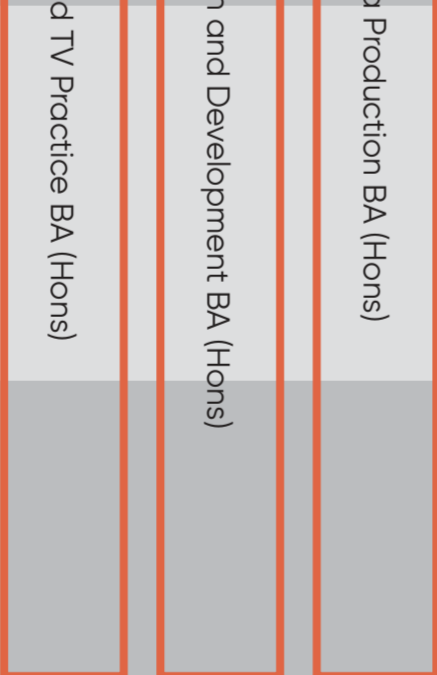
